Exceptions: Adequate sample already on file with Department of State Police or taking a sample would pose substantial and unreasonable risk to health

Sex Offender Reporting: ORS 163A.025, ORS 163A.030

Reporting required if court finds juvenile not rehabilitated and a threat to public safety

If required, juveniles must register if adjudicated of **FELONY** sex crimes; Oregon defines the following offenses as sex crimes:

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| a. Rape; | o. Possession of Materials Depicting Sexually Explicit Conduct of a Child; |
| b. Sodomy; | p. Kidnapping II, if the victim was under 18 years of age, except by a parent or by a person to be found within the jurisdiction of the juvenile court; |
| c. Unlawful Sexual Penetration; | q. Online Sexual Corruption of a Child, if the offender reasonably believed the child to be more than five years younger than the offender; |
| d. Sexual Abuse; | r. Luring a Minor, if the offender reasonably believed the minor or the purported minor to be more than five years younger than the offender or under 16 years of age, and the court designates in the judgment that the offense is a sex crime; |
| e. Incest with a Child Victim; | s. Sexual Assault of an Animal; |
| f. Using a Child in a Display of Sexually Explicit Conduct; | t. Public Indecency or Private Indecency, if the person has a prior conviction for a sex crime; |
| g. Encouraging Child Sexual Abuse; | u. Trafficking in Persons as described in ORS 163.266(1)(b) or (c); |
| h. Transporting Child Pornography into the State; | v. Purchasing Sex with a Minor, if the court designates the offense a sex crime pursuant to ORS 163.413(3)(d) or the offense is the second or subsequent conviction under ORS 163.413(3)(b)(B); |
| i. Paying for Viewing a Child's Sexually Explicit Conduct; | w. Invasion of Personal Privacy I, if the court designates the offense as a sex crime pursuant to ORS 163.701(3); |
| j. Compelling Prostitution; | x. Any attempt to commit crimes (a) to (w) set forth above; |
| k. Promoting Prostitution; | y. Burglary, when committed with intent to commit crimes (a) to (w) set forth above; or |
| l. Kidnapping I, if the victim was under 18 years of age; | z. Criminal Conspiracy if the offender agrees with one or more persons to engage in or cause the performance of an offense listed in paragraphs (a) to (w) set forth above. |

Driving Privileges

Juvenile Specific Suspensions or Revocation of Driving Privileges

- Possession of Weapon in a Public Building, Court Facility or School by person 13-17 years of age at the time of adjudication; Mandatory Suspension: ORS 809.260(1). Length: ORS 809.280(6). Reinstatement: ORS 809.260(3).
- Unlawful Possession, Manufacture or Delivery of Controlled Substance by person 13-17 years of age at the time of the adjudication; Mandatory Suspension: ORS 809.260(1). Length: ORS 809.280(6). Reinstatement: ORS 809.260(3).
- Possession, Use or Abuse of Alcohol by person 13-20 years of age at the time of the offense; Mandatory Suspension: ORS 809.260(2). Length: ORS 809.280(6). Reinstatement: ORS 809.260(3).
- Failure to Appear for Citation for Purchase or Possession of Alcohol by person under 21 years of age by person 13-20 years of age; Mandatory Suspension: ORS 419C.472/ORS 471.430(6). Length: ORS 809.280(4). Reinstatement: ORS 809.220(3).
- Purchase or Possession of Alcohol by person under 21 years of age by Misrepresentation of Age; Mandatory Suspension: ORS 471.430(5). Length: ORS 471.430(5)/ORS 809.280(8). Reinstatement: ORS 471.430(5).
- Misrepresentation of Age by a Minor to Purchase or Consume Alcohol; Mandatory Suspension: ORS 165.805(3) Length: ORS 165.805(3)/ORS 809.280(8). Reinstatement: ORS 165.805(3).
- Purchase or Possession of Tobacco by Misrepresentation of Age; Mandatory Suspension for second or subsequent offense: ORS 167.401/ORS 809.423. Length, Reinstatement: ORS 167.401(3)(b).
- Suspension at the request of School Superintendent or Board when student at least 15 years of age expelled for bringing weapon to school; suspended or expelled twice for assault, menacing, harassment, intimidation, coercion or willful damage of property; suspended or expelled twice for controlled substance violation; Discretionary Suspension: ORS 339.254/ORS 809.423. Length: 339.254.
- Possession of less than one ounce of marijuana by person under 18 years of age; Discretionary Suspension: ORS 809.265(2); Length: ORS 809.280(9).

Suspension or Revocation of Driving Privileges for Adjudication Same as for Conviction: ORS 419C.007/ ORS 809.412

- The juvenile court shall order suspension or revocation of driving privileges for a juvenile adjudicated for an offense that is grounds for suspension or revocation upon conviction under ORS 809.409, 809.411, 809.510 to 809.545 or 813.400 or any other law requiring suspension or revocation upon conviction

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
